Title: A Resolution Regarding Access for OPSU Students with Physical Disabilities

Whereas OPSU is a university that serves a number of students who have physical limitations; and

Whereas OPSU has demonstrated a commitment to making our campus accessible to students with physical and learning disabilities; and

Whereas no sidewalk exists on the section of Harrison Avenue that is proximate to the Oscar Williams Field House; and

Whereas a dangerous situation exists where physically disabled students who are traveling from the Aggie Apartments to the main buildings on campus must use Harrison Avenue; and

Whereas because of its sloped sides, which were designed for the purpose of drainage, physically disabled students frequently use the middle of Harrison Avenue to traverse between the apartments and the main campus; and

Whereas Harrison Avenue is sparsely lighted and students with physical disabilities enrolled in night classes or engaged in nighttime campus activities often have to use the middle of Harrison Avenue in the dark; and

Whereas drivers frequently travel Harrison Avenue at relatively excessive rates of speed and have on numerous occasions had to rapidly slow down to accommodate both the traffic of students with physical disabilities as well as routine pedestrian traffic; and

Whereas sections of Harrison Avenue contain no crosswalks to protect both pedestrian or disabled student traffic; and

Whereas the lack of a sidewalks, crosswalks, speed bumps or sufficient lighting pose a clear and present danger to students with physical disabilities and all students, faculty and staff traveling between the south side of campus and the north side.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the OPSU Faculty Senate that OPSU should seek to accommodate the safety concerns of all students by addressing the lack of sidewalks, speed bumps, crosswalks or sufficient lighting on Harrison Avenue.

 - What assessment is and how we measure
 - We have built a culture of assessment beginning with the Student Learning Academy started in 2007. All deans attended along with Kirstan serving as a chair
 - Since then, each department/degree was able to develop their own assessment plans that include a mission for the degree, goals, and student learning outcomes. Thus by being able to create their own plans that fit into what and how they expected students to learn, they were able to take greater ownership in the overall process. They got to pick what they saw as valuable and in turn were able to find the results more useful vs doing it for the sake of accreditation.
 - There have also been templates and best practices guides created for the faculty to help them better understand assessment (created in Spring 2009). Along with individual meetings and training sessions provided to various faculty/departments/schools (with the biggest push of training occurring in Fall 2007/Spring 2008)

- When further questions/explanations are required, faculty can always call and ask for help from the Assessment Director, other faculty members, Deans, etc...thus, the overall dialog has become more open regarding assessment practices.
- The IR/Assessment office conducts a min of 6 main surveys that faculty are able to have broken into the results for just those in their school/major if requested. Additionally, OPSU conducts course evaluations every fall/spring semesters. Moreover, some majors have national competitions for the students to evaluate their knowledge...along with many other outside classroom activities/evaluations. This additional information which may not be listed in the specific overall assessment plans per say also helps faculty evaluate their perspective degree programs by providing them with future insight...thus faculty are now starting to feel comfortable with assessment in general they are starting to look for other ways to measure student learning that may not take place in the actual classroom but is still important (e.g., co-curricular learning such as service learning projects)
- Now able to use assessment plan results in the 5-year program review reports as well.

General Education

- OPSU has created a general education plan that is built around the required coursework listed in the catalog. We assess all general education courses with either common exam questions, pre/post testing, or rubrics.
- Additionally we use the OGET results, a GPA comparison between traditional OPSU students and students who transferred in with their general education coursework met, and survey results conducted asking students if they feel as if they have acquired the expected knowledge in the various areas of general education.
- We have also created a template and a general guideline/help sheet that the faculty are using to report the results just as we have for the program assessment plans (this template was just implemented for the Fall 2009-Spring 2010 reporting cycle).

Whereas the misalignment between OPSU's schedule and that of most other universities causes international students to miss up to two weeks of classes due to student visa procedures; and

Whereas the misalignment between OPSU's schedule and area K-12 institutions puts the areas concurrently enrolled students at a disadvantage due to their late entry into their courses; and

Whereas OPSU misses the potential enrollment of online students who frequently are unaware of the fact that OPSU's semester starts at a time that is not aligned with other universities, or who opt to enroll in online classes at institutions with more favorable schedules; and

Whereas OPSU misses the potential enrollment of students who are unaware the fact that OPSU begins its semester at a time that is not aligned with the traditional starting time of other universities; and

Whereas OPSU consumes more resources, both energy and otherwise, by starting their semester earlier.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the OPSU Faculty Senate that OPSU should adopt scheduling protocols and processes that are consistent with the majority of public colleges and universities in the state of Oklahoma.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the OPSU Faculty Senate that OPSU should not start prior to local K-12 public schools to prevent issues with concurrent enrollment and student hardships regarding childcare and employment.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the OPSU Faculty Senate that OPSU should not start more than one week prior to major Oklahoma universities so as not to put OPSU at a competitive disadvantage for enrollment.
