The passing score for the SAT® shall be a total score of 1120 including the following scores on the essay section: five (5) on Reading, four (4) on Analysis, and five (5) on Writing.



THE PANHANDLE PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP COMMITMENT FORM MUST BE SIGNED BY THE STUDENT EACH ACADEMIC SEMESTER. THE STUDENT MUST ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES:

- 1. Must maintain continuous enrollment at Oklahoma Panhandle State University in an education pathway
- 2. Maintain a minimum overall cumulative GPA of 2.5 and a GPA of 2.5 in the program of study.
- 3. Successfully complete at least 15 credit hours each for each spring and fall semester. Students may take up to 6 credit hours in the summer, not to exceed 36 hours annually.
- 4. Length of scholarship eligibility will be determined by the classification of the student. Freshmen will be eligible for a term that does not exceed 4.5 years, sophomores 3.5 years, juniors 2.5 years, and seniors 1.5 years.
- 5. Maintain student conduct codes as cited in the OPSU Student Handbook.

COMMITMENT TO WORK AGREEMENT:

I, _______, understand and acknowledge that the Panhandle Promise Scholarship program contains a two-year work obligation upon graduation and do hereby agree to the following terms and conditions of such work obligation. I further understand that if I do not maintain eligibility for the Panhandle Promise Scholarship program or fulfill the service repayment, I will be required to reimburse Oklahoma Panhandle State University (OPSU) the monies received by me or paid on my behalf.



I understand that the Panhandle Promise Scholarship will cover the remaining balance of tuition and fees as funds are available at OPSU after my financial aid is applied (not including loans) each semester. The Panhandle Promise Scholarship cannot be applied to fines or other allowable charges on my account other than tuition and fees. I understand that the Panhandle Promise Scholarship will only pay for one repeat of a previous course. More than one repeated course will not be calculated in my enrollment status pertaining to the Panhandle Promise Scholarship.

I understand that by signing this contract I will be obligated to work as a classroom teacher in a public school physically located in either Cimarron, Texas, or Beaver Counties in the Oklahoma panhandle for two years as agreed to on the Panhandle Promise Scholarship Commitment Form I signed. In the case that I am unable to fulfill my commitment to work obligation or in the case of extreme hardship, as determined by the Scholarship Director, the work obligation and/or any damages for non-compliance may be waived partially or totally by the Scholarship Appeal Committee. If I am selected for a classroom teaching position in a public school in the Oklahoma panhandle and complete my work obligation, the repayment obligation will be deemed satisfied in full.

I understand that I must notify the Scholarship Director of my place of employment every six months in writing or immediately in the event I transfer to a new eligible workplace. I understand that I will be obligated to reimburse OPSU for all scholarship monies received by me or paid on my behalf if any of the following should occur:

- I do not maintain continuous enrollment and communication with the Scholarship Director.
- I do not complete my degree within the timeline listed (Maintenance Criteria 5)
- I am suspended from the college (conduct, grades, etc.)
- I change my field of study
- I fail to communicate with the Scholarship Director regarding my employment
- I fail to complete the work commitment obligation
- I fail to report a change in my employment status to the Scholarship Director within thirty days

I understand that if I am required to fulfill the reimbursement requirement instead of my work obligation, I must make satisfactory payment arrangements with OPSU upon receipt of notification of reimbursement. Unpaid accounts will be assigned to collection within 90 days.

APPLICATION CRITERIA:

- 1. Must be currently admitted to and enrolled in Oklahoma Panhandle State University with an education degree path
- 2. Incoming freshmen must have a high school GPA of 2.75; transfer and current students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.75.
- 3. By the application's deadline, submit a completed FAFSA that includes the OPSU code number and show evidence of application for at least three private scholarships (which may include OPSU Foundation scholarships)
- 4. Must have received a composite score of 22+ on the ACT with the <u>writing section included</u> or a total score of 1120+ SAT including the following scores on the essay section: five (5) on Reading, four (4) on Analysis, and five (5) on Writing, *OR* current college general education GPA is 3.0+ (a minimum of 30 hours).
- 5. Must submit three (3) letters of recommendation from teachers, employers, administrators, etc. not related to the applicant.
- 6. Submit an essay that provides background information, future aspirations as an educator, and what it would mean to the applicant to be awarded this scholarship.
- 7. Must commit to work as a classroom teacher in an Oklahoma Panhandle public school for two years immediately after graduation

MAINTENANCE CRITERIA:

- 1. Maintain continuous enrollment at Oklahoma Panhandle State University in an education pathway
- 2. Maintain a minimum overall cumulative GPA of 2.5 and a GPA of 2.5 in the program of study
- 3. Successfully complete a minimum of 15 hours each Spring and Fall semester, excluding the student teaching semester (12 hours). The annual maximum number of hours cannot exceed 36.
- 4. Continue to submit FAFSA each year and show proof of application and/or renewal for at least three (3) outside scholarships (which may include OPSU Foundation scholarships)
- 5. Length of scholarship eligibility will be determined by the classification of the student. Freshmen will be eligible for a term that does not exceed 4.5 years, sophomores 3.5 years, juniors 2.5 years, and seniors 1.5 years.
- 6. Maintain student conduct codes as cited in the OPSU Student Handbook.
- 7. Cannot be suspended from the college (conduct, grades, etc.)
- 8. Cannot change field of study
- 9. Cannot fail to communicate with the scholarship director regarding employment
- 10. Cannot fail to complete the work commitment obligation
- 11. Cannot fail to report a change in employment status to the scholarship director within thirty days



PROCESS:

Deadline for scholarship applications is June 1. (This way we will know about the GAP for students.)

The selection committee will meet in June and review applications in light of the rubric.

Recipients will be notified by July 1.

Students may apply their senior year of high school, as transfer students, or as current OPSU education students.
